<i>The Power of Youth & Adult Relationships</i>	Family, Professional, Youth 16+	Participants will identify tools that will lead to powerful youth and adult relationships.	This session focuses on identifying effective tools that can lead to a powerful youth and adult relationship. During the session participants will begin by completing a self- assessment of their current attitudes and behaviors towards youth and adult relationships. Participants will also be exposed to the benefits of developing and maintaining these youth and adult relationships. As a group we will discuss barriers and misconceptions of youth and adult relationships. To conclude the session participants will develop a personal action plan that will enhance their own youth adult relationships.	2
<i>Parenting Together</i>	* Audience must include Birth Parents <i>partnering with</i> foster parents, kinship parents, and social service provider	Promotes the sharing of responsibility for the health, safety and wellbeing of children/youth served within public systems.	This innovative training's major focus is around the self-assessment of the participant's current attitudes and behaviors. In doing so, participants will self-identify the continued benefits of developing and maintaining effective relationships with birthparents. As a group, we will discuss preconceived notions and possible barriers. Participants will leave this training their personal action plan.	2

<i>Understanding Effective Services</i>	Family/ Youth 16+	Assisting youth and family members in understanding the benefits of having an informed dialogue with service providers about the effectiveness of the services they are providing.	Participants will understand that the effectiveness of services to treat social, emotional and behavioral issues vary, and that some services have higher levels of demonstrated effectiveness. Moreover, that service effectiveness is important when partnering with providers to make care planning decisions. The intent of the training is for participants to understand that service effectiveness is on a continuum, based on research. The quality of research varies; stronger research designs and methods supports greater confidence in the conclusions of the studies. Fidelity to the service model is important in achieving the outcomes reported in the literature. Information about levels of effectiveness is easily available on credible websites. Youth and families can benefit from having a dialogue about service effectiveness with providers.	4

<p><i>Pathways to Partnership</i> sponsored by the County of San Diego HHSA Children's Mental Health Services-MHSA</p>	<p>Family & Youth 16+</p>	<p>Basic training prepares family members and youth for employment or meaningful involvement within public child family serving systems and their providing agencies.</p>	<p>This training guides family members and youth who have had involvement with public systems, from being a recipient of services to opening opportunities to become a "partnership broker". This training teaches family members and youth to utilize their experience (as a recipient of services from a public child-family serving system) to assist other family members, youth and providers to better understand the cultural differences, system mandates, and roles within a children's System of Care of Family and Youth partners. Furthermore, this training provides experiential activities that help family members or youth identify a meaningful career path within a Children's System of Care. Provides and in-depth review of roles for family/youth involvement, as well as prepares recipients to serve family and youth receiving services, to identify resources, linkages and support systems, that assist in recipients in meeting treatment goals. Furthermore, this training supports a cohesive foundation of the roles & responsibilities of Family & Youth Partners, this providing the community with consistency in training and an organized service-delivery support for the advancement of Family-Youth-Professional Partnership.</p>	<p>40</p>
